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The Chairman, in his opening remarks thanked the organisers for coming up with such a laudable idea especially targeted at female students in secondary schools with the sole aim of inculcating in them the positive virtues of obedience, good behaviour, intelligence, discipline, honesty, hard work, etc. According to him, such recognition and reward for excellence would help stem the ever rising trend of moral decadence in our society. The drift from rural to urban with the eventual exportation of our young girls will only be curb by events such as this where life's true picture is presented and they allowed to make the choice that willultimately shape their destiny.

Thereafter, the goodwill message from the President & Founder, Dr. Mrs. Josephine Okosun was read by Mrs. Phillipa Akpata. Mrs. Okosun congratulated the award recipients urging them to continue to improve on the virtues which helped in their nomination by their respective Principals/Teachers in the first instance. This, she said would not only make them successful in life but will to a great extent shape the society for good.

Highlight of the president's message which drew a loud applause from the audience was the Association's intent to increase the numbers of awardees from the present allocation of 12 students to 40 recipients this year scheduled to half in the month of July. To this end, letters addressed to principals were distributed to the CIEs and Education Secretaries for onward distribution to them.

The wife of the former Registrar, Ambrose Alli University, Ekpoma and Chief Inspector for Education (Esan Central Local Government Area, Irrua), Mrs. K. Edokpayi went down memory lane to recount her family ordeal in an effort by one lady to lure and "export" her and other siblings to the illicit business but was able to overcome due to the family's moral upbringing. She disapproved of the generally held mentality that poverty is the root cause of prostitution, maintaining that though they were of poor background, they were still able to overcome the temptation. It was a touching story and was listened to with rapt attention by all.

Mr. Emman Obinyan, in his remark, recounted his experience while on an official trip to Italy. Practitioners of the trade, mostly young girls of Edo State extraction, he said, are not even happy doing it judging by their open and blunt confession. He was of the opinion that if virtues are recognized and appreciated at the early stages of these young girls' lives, in line with AAWE objectives, we would all be able to salvage the situation for good. He thereafter pledged that his wife would henceforth pick up the bills of *Miss Irabor Franca*, an orphan and student of Our Lady of Lourdes Secondary School, Uromi throughout her Senior Secondary School education. Mr. Osime also pledged to pick up the bills of the student from Emu.

Sir Ikidi, principal of Annunciation Catholic College, Irrua, in his characteristic manner admonished all present, especially the female students to be mindful of their educational career if they ever hope to excel in life.

Highlight of the ceremony was the presentation of certificates, plaques and cash prizes to about eleven (11) female students cut across the 5 LGAs of Esanland by the organizers. The Chief Inspectors of Education, Education Secretaries, Chairman of the occasion, President / Founder's mother, Association of Esan Professionals' Chairman & Chairman of the Education Committee, etc took turns to present prizes to the recipients.
